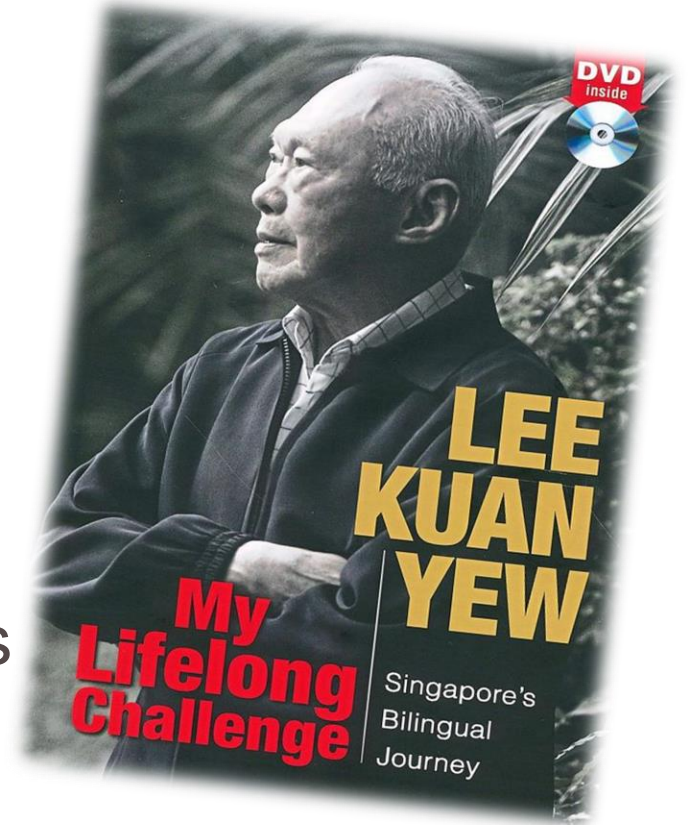

	Special Call for Projects (SCFP)	Regular Call for Proposals (CFP)
Frequency	Once off 6 May – 31 July 2020	Twice Yearly Submission Windows: Jan & July
Submission	Completed Project	Proposal with timeline to be proposed by the applicant
Type	Online digital resources	No restriction, e.g. Print and Non-Print resources, Programmes, Songs, etc.
Target Audience	Children 0-6 years old or for their parents /care-givers	Preschoolers and Young Adults
Grant Amount	Up to \$10,000 per successful project. May scale up for further development	No cap, applicant to submit budget proposal
Marketing Plan	Not required	To be proposed by the applicant
Payment	One lump sum within 2 months upon announcement of outcome	In tranches

About Intellectual Property (IP)

- Applicants should own the **IP rights** or are the **sole licensor** of the project content and have not previously granted any rights to any third party.
- If not, applicants should have **obtained written clearance** from the IP rights owners for this application.
- Successful applicants will **retain the IP rights** for supported projects.

About Intellectual Property (IP)

- Applicants should own the **IP rights** or are the **licensor** of the project content. IP rights are not granted or transferred to the applicant.



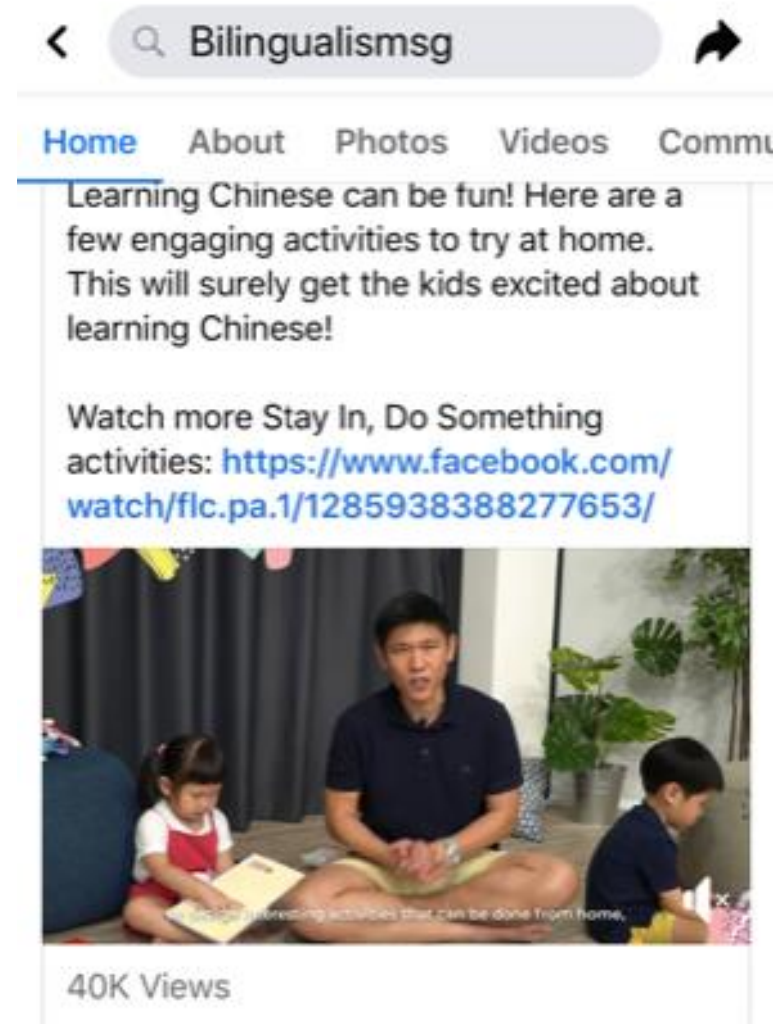

Possible Project Type

e.g. Activities, Games or Story-telling

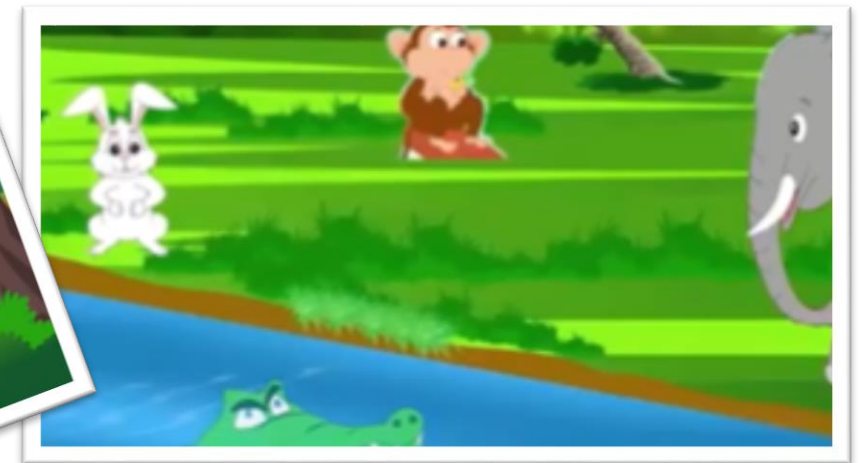

Possible Project Type

Animation with **music, songs, stories** for children to learn Mother Tongue Languages (CL, ML or TL), culture, values, etc.

9 July 2020



Type of Project NOT Recommended

- With commercial elements, e.g. Advertisement
- With spelling mistakes, mispronunciation
- Not Age-appropriate, e.g. language, content, pace
- Learning design unable to cater to the learning needs of children

Question:

Is there a restriction on the duration of the resources?

Frequently Asked Questions

Question:

Is there a restriction on the duration of the resources?

Answer:

No. Preferably not more than 10 min per resource for effectiveness.

Frequently Asked Questions

Question:

Is there a restriction on the number of resources to be submitted in one application?

Answer:

No. It is the quality that counts, not the quantity.

Question:

Can we submit more than one application?

Question:

Can we submit more than one application?

Answer:

Yes, as long as the content is different.

Question:

The Fund will liaise with the representative only.

Yes, you may include manpower cost in planning, designing and executing.

Yes. However, it should be value-adding and able to enhance the learning experience.

Frequently Asked Questions

Question:

Will my submission to this Special Call for Projects affect my chances to be supported by the Usual Call for Proposals?

Answer:

No. It is the quality of the submission that counts.

Frequently Asked Questions

Question:

Are we able to submit an incomplete or draft version for this Special Call for Project?

Answer: The panel evaluators will evaluate based on the quality of the completed project. Incomplete projects or proposals will not qualify for a grant.
